A Natural Host for Global Environmental Leadership

The United Arab Emirates stands at the intersection of innovation, ambition, and ecological responsibility. As the first nation in the MENA region to commit to Net Zero by 2050, the UAE has embedded sustainability into its national fabric—through policies like the UAE Green Agenda 2030, the National Climate Change Plan, and leadership roles at global climate summits, including COP21, COP26, and COP28.

Hosting the IUCN World Conservation Congress 2025 reflects the UAE's growing stature as a convenor of bold climate action and multilateral environmental dialogue. With its unique biodiversity, from desert ecosystems to marine habitats, and a legacy of conservation, the UAE provides not only the platform but also the credibility to advance the goals of the Congress.

Key Congress Dates & Components

The Congress will feature several components, each playing a vital role in shaping the conservation agenda:

- Forum (9–12 October): The Forum addresses the economic, social, scientific and technical aspects of a wide range of issues related to nature conservation.
- **Members' Assembly (9th then 13–15 October):** The highest decision-making body of IUCN where Members vote on motions that guide the Union's work and elect the next President.
- **Exhibition (9–13 October):** A dynamic space displaying cutting-edge conservation initiatives, projects and partnerships.

There will also be a series of summits across the opening days of the event, including: The first <u>World Summit of Indigenous Peoples and Nature</u>, a <u>Business Summit</u>, a <u>Youth Summit</u>, a <u>Philanthropy Summit</u> and the 3rd MENA Oceans Summit.

IUCN Congress themes

The Congress will tackle five critical themes, each driving the bold, transformative change needed to secure a sustainable future for both nature and humanity:

- Scaling Up Resilient Conservation Action
- Reducing Climate Overshoot Risks
- Delivering on Equity
- Transitioning to Nature-Positive Economies and Societies
- Disruptive Innovation and Leadership for Conservation

Critical timing

With only five years remaining until the 2030 deadline for the Paris Agreement, Sustainable Development Goals, and Global Biodiversity Framework, the conference comes at a pivotal time for securing concrete actions towards the realisation of these critical goals.

Also taking place less than a month before the United Nations Climate Conference (UNFCCC) COP30, in Belém, Brazil, the IUCN Congress 2025 in Abu Dhabi emerges as a <u>pivotal opportunity</u> to elevate ambition, accelerate action and scale up collaborative solutions that address the needs of both nature and people.

Policy implications

The outcomes of the 2025 Congress are expected to <u>directly influence international environmental policy, particularly</u> in the lead-up to the UNFCCC COP30 and ahead of the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) COP17 and the UNFCCC COP31 in 2026.

Motions adopted by IUCN Members will provide critical guidance to national and multilateral strategies, reinforcing commitments under the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework and the Paris Agreement. International progress towards these commitments will be examined at COP30.

The Congress will also catalyse new partnerships and funding mechanisms, shaping the global policy landscape for ecosystem restoration, climate adaptation, and the protection and empowerment of Indigenous peoples.

Building on the success of previous initiatives, including the ISO 20121 certification awarded to the IUCN World Conservation Congress 2016 in Hawaii and IUCN Congress 2021 in Marseille, IUCN is working to further enhance its sustainable event management practices.

Working collaboratively with the <u>Global Destination Sustainability</u> <u>Movement</u> (GDS-Movement), a pioneering international agency dedicated to driving positive socio-economic and environmental transformation, and <u>Green Evénements</u>, an expert in developing responsible event strategies, IUCN is working towards achieving ISO 20121 certification once again. Specific actions include:

- Minimising the environmental impact of its events by reducing greenhouse gas emissions,
- · Minimising resource demand,
- Promoting good sustainability practices to participants, suppliers, and local communities.
